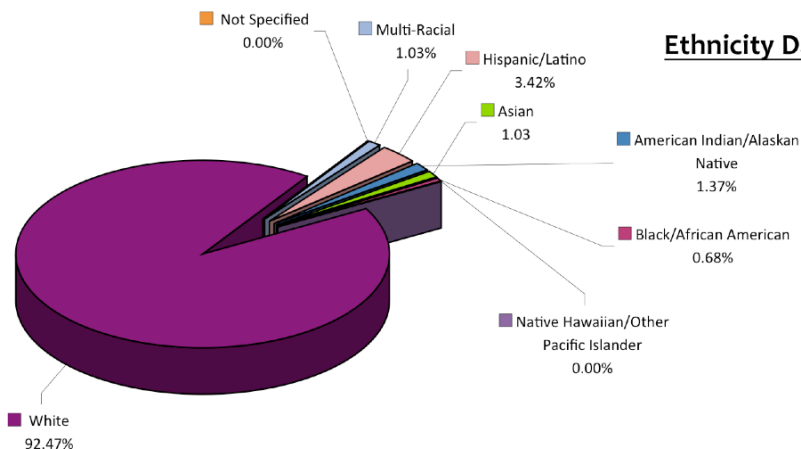

More About Clackamas Middle College

CMC is a comprehensive four-year high school enrolling 300 students in grades 9-12, accredited by the Northwest Association of Accredited Schools. While CMC is supported by the North Clackamas School District, some of our students live in neighboring districts. Over 150 of our students participate in our College Extended Options (CEO) program by enrolling in community college courses. The school opened in September 2003, and continues to improve on producing quality graduates: CMC had 14 students graduate in 2005, 38 in 2006, 45 in 2007, 71 students in 2008, and 75 students in 2009.

CMC is designed to give students the opportunity to earn both high school and college credits simultaneously with the goal of earning a high school diploma, a transfer degree, or certificate of completion. There are three programs within Clackamas Middle College where students can obtain college credit. The programs are: CMC College Prep, CMC College Cohort, and College Extended Options (CEO). Each program allows students the opportunity to transition to Clackamas Community College as full-time college students. Every term, Clackamas Middle College assesses its students, and places them in the proper program based on their "college readiness." Six on-campus teachers, three counselors, one administrator, and one secretary collaborate extensively with each other and community college partners to maximize student success. Visiting instructors from Clackamas Community College come to the CMC campus daily and teach classes throughout the year. Other students take their courses exclusively at community colleges through our College Extended Options program.

The mission of North Clackamas School District is to attain excellence in education through the consistent provision of quality programs, which assist all students in assuming responsibility for their lives as learners and productive citizens.

School Improvement Plan
