



## About Clackamas Middle College

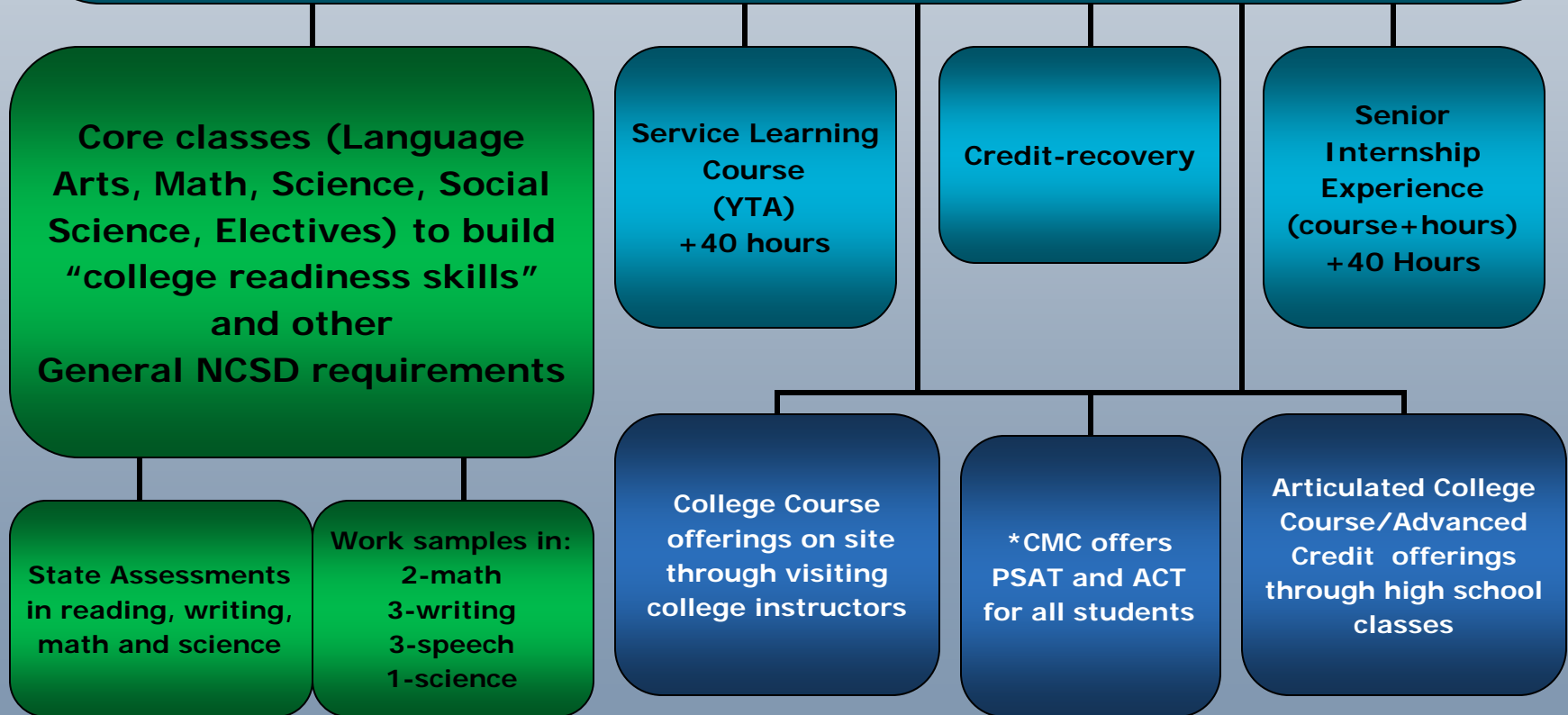
CMC provides an innovative and challenging personalized education that prepares students socially and academically for its college and career-related programs.

- **Clackamas Middle College** enrolls its students in its **College Prep Program** which offers core classes aimed at building each student's college readiness skills. Once students are successful in its **College Prep Program** they are nominated for CMC's **Cohort Program** where they will sharpen their college readiness skills. After success in the Cohort Program, students will then enter CMC's **College Extended Options (CEO) Program** where they will pursue a college degree or work certificate while places its students in one of three programs based on college placement scores and student performance.
  1. **CMC College Prep**
  2. **CMC Cohort (Cohort 1 or Cohort 2)**
  3. **College Extended Options (CEO)**

CMC offers an accredited North Clackamas School District High School Diploma through innovative high school/college transition classes along with a specialized service learning and senior internship program. The requirements of the diploma follow NCSD requirements and guidelines.

# Clackamas Middle College College Extended Options (CEO)

The College Extended Options Program (CEO) offers students who have college readiness skills, rigorous and varied educational experiences with academic planning and financial support for tuition and books. Students complete an educational plan to help them obtain a specific college certificate or a two year college degree along with their high school diploma. The aforementioned philosophy is obtained through a collaboration with a community college to provide an individualized college experience for our students.

- The **CMC College Extended Options Program (CEO)** involves two important aspects with which it serves its students:

## **1. Student Progress and Tracking**

- Year to Year Goal Planning
- Academic Advising
- Specialized Support
- Updating CEO Student Educational Plans

## **2. Financial Support**

- Tuition
- Book Purchasing

- Must have at least 18 credits
- Must have a 3.0 GPA
- Must test into:
  - Reading 115
  - Writing 121
  - Math 60
- Advisory program to connect to CMC

- Enrolled with success in at least 18 transferrable college credits (above 100 level courses)
- Successful in an already established program
