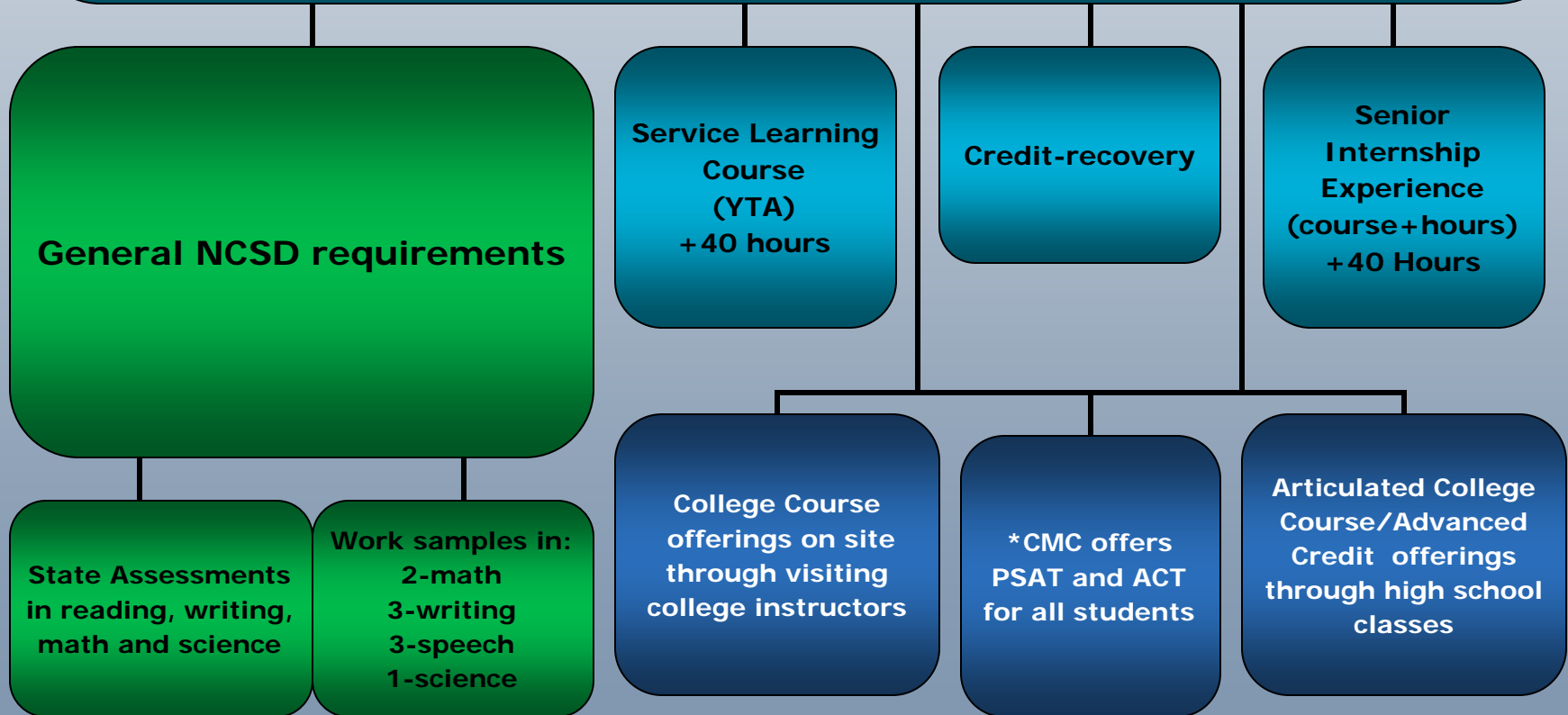

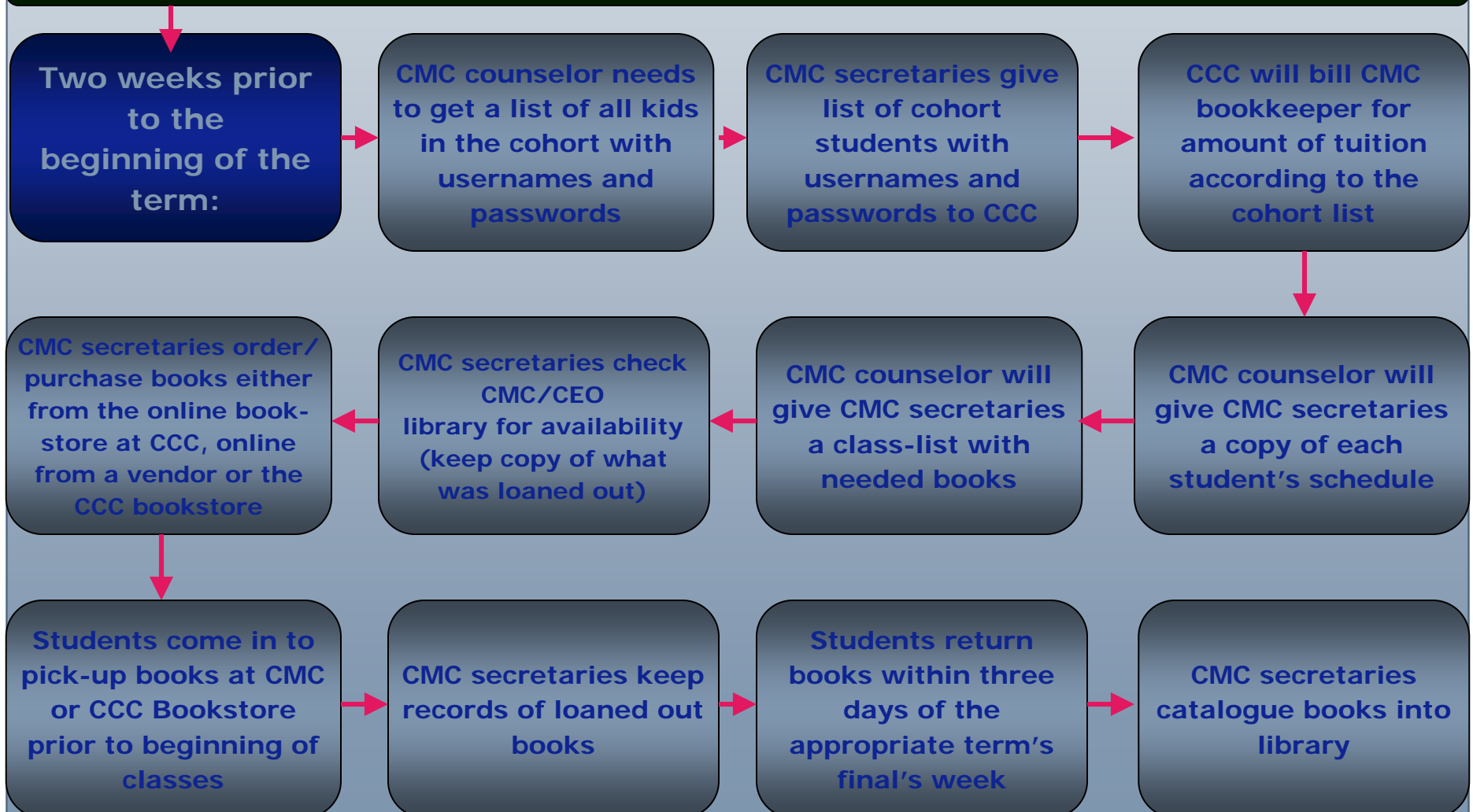

Procedures for Tuition/Books

Two weeks prior to the beginning of the term:

CMC counselor gives the list of classes and books needed for the college classes offered at CMC

CMC counselor supplies class list of students enrolled in college classes offered at the CMC campus

CCC sends bill to bookkeeper for the payment of visiting college professors

CMC secretaries check for availability and order as necessary
